<b><u>Hepatitis B</u></b>	 <b>2 doses</b> (if 3 doses not received in infancy) <i>2<sup>nd</sup> dose 6 months after 1<sup>st</sup> dose</i>	
<b><u>HPV</u></b> <sup>¶</sup> (human papillomavirus)	 <b>2 doses</b> <i>2<sup>nd</sup> dose 6 months after 1<sup>st</sup> dose</i>	
<b><u>Varicella</u></b> <sup>‡</sup> (chickenpox)	 <b>1 or 2 doses</b> <sup>‡</sup> <i>2<sup>nd</sup> dose at least 3 months after 1<sup>st</sup> dose</i>	
<b><u>Meningococcal Quadrivalent Conjugate</u></b>		 <b>1 dose</b>
<b><u>Tdap</u></b> (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis)		 <b>1 dose</b>

¶ The HPV vaccine has been offered to boys in grade 6 since September 2017.

‡ Children who had chickenpox or shingles disease, diagnosed by a health care provider, at 1 year of age or older do not need the chickenpox vaccine. Children who received a single dose of chickenpox vaccine at a younger age only need 1 dose in grade 6. Children who have never received the chickenpox vaccine need 2 doses.
